PANDA BEAR Person Pitch (Paw Tracks) This solo album from a member of Animal Collective combines ethereal vocals, sample use, and pure concentrated awesomess (generally lethal in its un-cut form). Fact: album contains the catchiest twelve-minute song ever recorded.

I'M FROM BARCELONA Let Me Introduce My Friends (Mute) This band of 26 lying Swedes (not from Barcelona!) throw down some glee-club style indie-pop (emphasis on the GLEE). If the song "Treehouse" doesn't make you smile, you are never going to be allowed to join my go-kart club.

LCD SOUNDSYSTEM Sound of Silver (DFA) James Murphy, the dean of the University of Hipster Studies, releases another album of NYC-centric, cowbell-heavy, faux-disco jamz. Did this blurb set the record for hyphen use? What-about-now,-suckers-?

III Myth Takes (Warp) The un-Google-able Sacramento/Portland/NY dance-punk band would love it if they could make you shake your ass all night long. In order to accomplish this, they have released another album of upbeat, Can-loving songs to get your sweat on by. Thoughtful lads.

FUJIYA & MIYAGI Transparent Things (Deaf Dumb + Blind) Do you not have enough British, liquid, narcotic electro-pop to make out to? Check out "Transparent Things" and let's all get mono!

DO MAKE SAY THINK You, You're a History in Rust (Constellation) Another album of expansive and diverse jazz-influenced post-rock from our neighbors to the North. They only thing they love more than making interesting and intricate music for you is, apparently, verbs.

ARTICHOKE Never Mind the Bollocks Here's the Sex Pistols by Artichoke (Greeen) Ever listen to old punk albums and think to yourself, "This is great, but I really wished it was super folky and had kazoo and ukulele solos"? Baby, have I got the album for you.

THE BESNARD LAKES The Besnard Lakes are the Dark Horse (Jagjaguwar) Screw Pink Floyd. Next time I want to get super high to cosmic, reverby, harmonic pop, I'll throw this in. Then I'll probably eat an entire box of "Chicken in a Biscuit" and talk about nothing but how cool it would be to own the spaceship from "Flight of the Navigator" for the next couple of hours.

KAREN DALTON In My Own Time (Light In The Attic Records) A reissue of the 1971 folk/country cult classic, with the most notable members of her cult being Nick Cave, Bob Dylan, Lucinda Williams, and Devendra Banhart. Dalton glides through her song interpretations with eerie and beautiful results.

KING KONG DING DONG King Kong Ding Dong EP (Badmaster Records) This Philadelphia supergroup binds its No Wave influences with a pop sensibility, proving on its six song Ep that you can bridge the gap between Glenn Branca & Bunky.

DUNICE THERIOT The Essential Collection (Swallow) The late Dunice Theriot made recordings for the sort of Louisiana honky tonks a softie from the city had better avoid.

MELECHESH *Emissaries* (The End Records) It's not very often that you hear a band claiming to be "Sumerian thrashing black metal," but no other description would be fitting for Melechesh. Their heavily eastern influenced extreme metal sets a high benchmark for the style.

ALLONS BOIRE UN COUP A Collection of Cajun and Creole Drinking Songs (Valcour) Just what the title says, and from the finest musicians and production team in Louisiana roots music.

BIG D AND THE KIDS TABLE Strictly Rude (Side One Dummy Records) Boston's new kings of ska are back with their most mature record which is being hailed as an instant classic and the best ska record of the decade. Going for a more "rude" sound, the band adds a mix of dub and reggae to their usual ska and punk sound.

SMOKE OR FIRE This Sinking Ship (Fat Wreck Chords) Smoke or Fire are coming at you with their sophomore release, and their best material to date. Gruff melodic punk in the vein of Hot Water Music and the Lawrence Arms. Perfect for putting your fist in the air in rebellion or grabbing a few drinks with friends. For fans of the beard rock genre.

PIEBALD Accidental Gentlemen (Side One Dummy Records) Genre defying indie-punk that is satirical and poppy, unique and original. These songs will put a smile on your face and have you singing along in no time. Poppy indie punk for fans of things spanning Weezer to The Clash.

PSYOPUS *Our Puzzling Encounters Considered* (Metal Blade Records) This band writes some of the most schizophrenic, mind-boggling metal you're likely to find anywhere. OPEC could easily be marketed as "insanity on a disc." (Not recommended for the faint of heart.)

SATANIC PORNO CULT SHOP Orochi Under The Straight Edge Leaves (Vivo) It's taken close to a year for word of mouth to spread about SPCS seamlessly interwoven Pop, electronic noise, hiphop, & Missy Elliott covers. "Get Ur Freak On" for a memorable one hour journey.
